Pope Francis prays at Mass for victims of Covid-19

Pope Francis offers Mass on Tuesday for the many people who have died with Covid-19, and reflects on several attitudes that keep us from knowing Jesus.

At the start of Mass in the Casa Santa Marta on Tuesday, Pope Francis prayed for the victims of the novel coronavirus.

"Today we pray for the deceased who have died because of the pandemic. They have died alone, without the caresses of their loved ones. So many did not even have a funeral. May the Lord welcome them in His glory."

Stumbling blocks to faith

In his homily, the Pope reflected on the day's Gospel (John 10:22-30), in which several Jews ask Jesus to say openly whether He is the Christ. Jesus responds that He has already told them so, yet they do not believe.

Pope Francis said the episode is an invitation to reflect on our own faith. "Do I believe? What makes me stop outside the door that is Jesus?"

He went on to consider several "prejudiced attitudes that prevent us from progressing in the knowledge of Jesus."

Imprisoned by wealth

The chief among them, said Pope Francis, is wealth.

"There are many of us who have entered the door of the Lord but then fail to continue because we are imprisoned by wealth. Jesus takes a hard line regarding wealth... Wealth keeps us from going ahead. Do we need to fall into poverty? No, but, we must not become slaves to wealth. Wealth is the lord of this world, and we cannot serve two masters."

Robbed of freedom by rigidity

Rigidity of heart is another stumbling block to faith, he noted.

"Jesus reproached the doctors of the law for their rigidity in interpreting the law, which is not faithfulness. Faithfulness is always a gift of God; rigidity is only security for oneself."

Pope Francis said a good woman came up to him once to ask his advice. She had gone to a wedding one Saturday afternoon, and thought that Mass would fulfill her Sunday obligation. But later she realized that the Mass readings did not correspond to those for Sunday. So she felt that she was in mortal sin because she had not attended "a real Sunday Mass".

The Pope said that kind of rigidity drives us away from the "wisdom and beauty of the Lord, and robs us of our freedom."

Stuck in apathy, clericalism

Pope Francis went on to name apathy, clericalism, and the worldly spirit as three other attitudes that keep us from progressing in our knowledge of Jesus.

Apathy, or *acedia*, he said, is a type of "tiredness that takes away our desire to strive forward and leaves us lukewarm."

Clericalism, he noted, seeks to put us in Jesus' place. Instead of letting the Master lead, clericalism imposes restrictions that must be met before one enters the door of faith.

"It is a terrible sickness that robs the faithful of freedom and impedes them from going to Jesus."

Bogged down in worldliness

The worldly spirit also stops us at the door of faith.

"We can think," he said, "of how some Sacraments are celebrated in some parishes. At times it is impossible to discern the grace and presence of Jesus."

"These are some of the things that stop us from becoming members of Jesus's flock. We are 'sheep' of all these things – wealth, apathy, rigidity, worldliness, clericalism, ideologies. But freedom is lacking and we cannot follow Jesus without freedom. At times freedom might go too far, and we might slip and fall. Yes, that's true. But this is slipping before becoming free."

Or free to advance in knowledge of Jesus

Concluding his homily, Pope Francis invited everyone to consider whether we are free from these temptations in order to progress in the knowledge of the Lord.

"May the Lord enlighten us to see within ourselves if we have the freedom required to go through the door which is Jesus, to go beyond it with Jesus in order to become sheep of His flock."

Father James Blount, SOLT, an exorcist and promoter of the Flame of Love International Movement, has said that the Flame of Love is the New Pentecost. The Catholic Church needs to spread this message in this time of darkness so that the light can shine brighter and the outpouring of graces can take effect on our souls. The Unity Prayer, a key prayer during the Cenacle meetings, is, in Father Blount's opinion, as beautiful as a poem, is powerful like a uranium bomb, and can transform the universe as we move to fulfill Jesus' prayer that all may be one.

"My Adorable Jesus, May our feet journey together. May our hands gather in unity. May our hearts beat in unison. May our souls be in harmony. May our thoughts be as one. May our ears listen to the silence together. May our glances profoundly penetrate each other. May our lips pray together to gain mercy from the Eternal Father. Amen."

Our parish has a Flame of Love Prayer Cenacle. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, its members had met in the Mary Chapel at 7:15 pm, and we look forward to meeting again in the "Post Pandemic Period."

You are encouraged to bring a container to take some Holy Water from the silver vessel near the front window of the church to the left of the altar. The water was blessed during the celebration of the Easter Vigil.

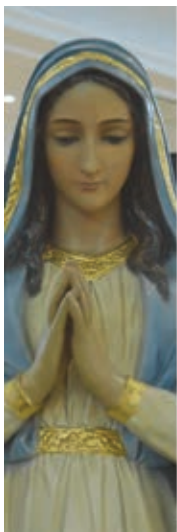

Set up an online account if you don't already have one

It only takes a few minutes to get started. Here's how:

1. Go to www.shopwithscrip.com and select **Join a Program**. Or on your phone, go to www.scripwallet.com and choose **Create an Account**.
2. You will be asked for an Enrollment Code. Enter **186LDF6L1L546** and select **Register**.
3. Fill in the enrollment form to finish setting up your account.
4. Register your phone for two-step verification.
5. Once your account is set up, you will have the option to link a bank account (PrestoPay) to easily pay using your checking or savings account. You can use a credit card by entering your card information at checkout. **(Please note:** There is a small fee for using online services)
6. Now you are ready to shop and earn online.

As you may know we are working from our homes. So, let us know if you have any questions. We can be reached by calling the rectory and leaving a voice message, which we are able to retrieve, or by emailing us at assumptionbvmscrip@gmail.com.

Please Note: If you need cards to use for reload purposes, they will have to be purchased directly from Assumption. We want to try and get you these cards so you can utilize the reload option when it's not available as an ecard. If you set up an account and require cards for reload purposes ONLY, please contact us. Let us know which cards you need. An example would be: Acme, they can only be reloaded, not available as an ecard. You would purchase the physical card through your account then we will contact you with a date and time for pick up in the church lobby.

The restrictions of the pandemic have made us come to appreciate all the more this “family” aspect, also from a spiritual point of view.

For this reason, I want to encourage everyone to rediscover the beauty of praying the Rosary at home in the month of May. This can be done either as a group or individually; you can decide according to your own situations, making the most of both opportunities. I am also providing two prayers to Our Lady that you can recite at the end of the Rosary, and that I myself will pray in the month of May, in spiritual union with all of you. I include them with this letter so that they are available to everyone.

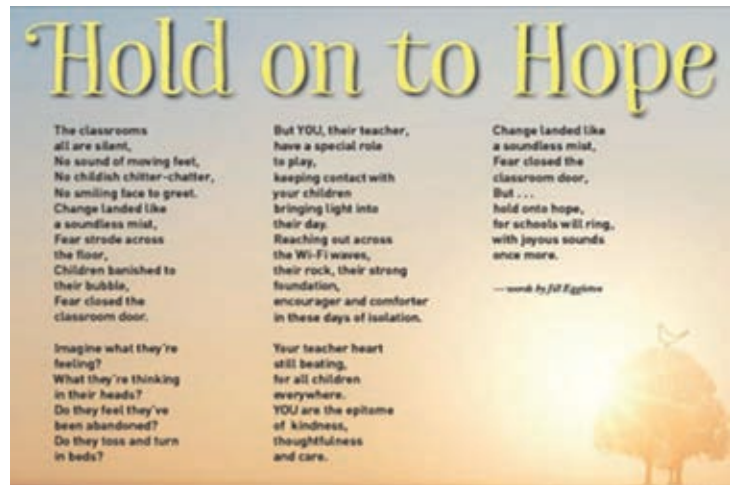


From the Principal's Desk

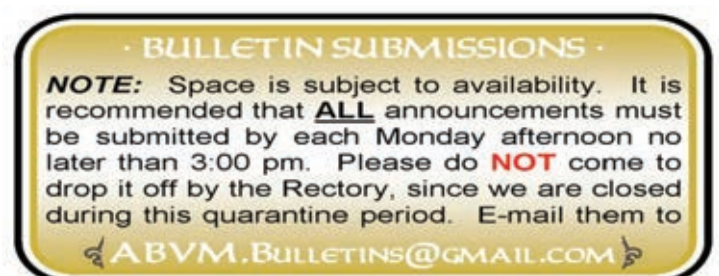

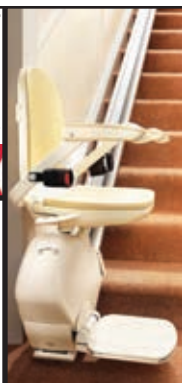
